CONSTITUTION FOR IMMANUEL LUTHERAN CHURCH OF INDEPENDENCE, IOWA

PREAMBLE

We, baptized members of the Church of Christ, responding in faith to the call of the Holy Spirit through the Gospel, desiring to unite together to preach the Word, administer sacraments, and carry out God's mission, do hereby adopt this constitution and solemnly pledge ourselves to be governed by its provisions. In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Chapter 1 NAME AND INCORPORATION

- C1.01 The name of this congregation shall be Immanuel Lutheran Church of Independence, IA.
- C1.02 For the purpose of this constitution and the accompanying bylaws, the congregation of Immanuel Lutheran Church of Independence, IA, is hereinafter designated as "this congregation."
- C1.11 This congregation shall be incorporated under the laws of the State of Iowa.

Chapter 2 CONFESSION OF FAITH

- *C2.01 This congregation confesses the Triune God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
- *C2.02 This congregation confesses Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior and the Gospel as the power of God for the salvation of all who believe.
- a. Jesus Christ is the Word of God incarnate, through whom everything was made and through whose life, death and resurrection God fashions a new creation.
 - b. The proclamation of God's message to us as both Law and Gospel is the Word of God, revealing judgment and mercy through word and deed, beginning with the Word in creation, continuing in the history of Israel, and centering it all its fullness in the person and work of Jesus Christ.
 - c. The canonical Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments are the written Word of God. Inspired by God's Spirit speaking through their authors, they record and announce God's revelation centering in Jesus Christ. Through them God's spirit speaks to us to create and sustain Christian faith and fellowship for service in the world.
- *C2.03 This congregation accepts the canonical Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments as the inspired Word of God and the authoritative source and norm of its proclamation, faith, and life.
- *C2.04 This congregation accepts the Apostles', Nicene, and Athanasian Creeds as true declarations of the faith of this congregation.
- *C2.05 The congregation accepts the Unaltered Augsburg Confession as true witness to the Gospel, acknowledging as one with it in faith and doctrine all churches that likewise accept the teachings of the Unaltered Augsburg Confession.

- *C2.06 This congregation accepts the other confessional writings in the Book of Concord, namely, the Apology of the Augsburg Confession, the Smalcald Articles and the Treatise, the Small Catechism, the Large Catechism, and the Formula of Concord, as further valid interpretations of the faith of the Church.
- *C2.07 This congregation confesses the Gospel, recorded in the Holy Scripture and confessed in the ecumenical creeds and Lutheran confessional writings, as the power of God to create and sustain the Church for God’s mission in the world.

Chapter 3 NATURE OF THE CHURCH

- *C3.01 All power in the Church belongs to the Lord Jesus Christ, its head. All actions of this congregation are to be carried out under His rule and authority.
- *C3.02 This church confesses the one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church and is resolved to serve Christian unity throughout the world.
- *C3.03 The Church exists both as an inclusive fellowship and as local congregations gathered for worship and Christian service. Congregations find their fulfillment in the universal community of the Church, and the universal Church exists in and through congregations. The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, therefore, derives its character and powers both from the sanction and representation of its congregations and from its inherent nature as an expression of the broader fellowship of the faithful. In length, it acknowledges itself to be in the historic continuity of the communion of saints; in breadth, it expresses the fellowship of believers and congregations in our day.
- *C3.04 This church, inspired and led by the Holy Spirit, participates in the Lutheran World Federation as a global communion of churches, engaging in faithful witness to the gospel of Jesus Christ and in service for the sake of god’s mission in the world.
- *C3.05 The name Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA or “this church”) as used herein refers in general references to this whole church, including its three expressions: congregations, synods, and the churchwide organization. The name Evangelical Lutheran Church in America is also the name of the corporation of the churchwide organization to which specific references may be made herein.

Chapter 4 STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

- *C4.01 The Church is a people created by God in Christ, empowered by the Holy Spirit, called and sent to bear witness to God’s creative, redeeming, and sanctifying activity in the World.
- *C4.02 To participate in God’s mission, this congregation as a part of the Church shall:
 - a. Worship God in proclamation of the Word and administration of the sacraments and through lives of prayer, praise, thanksgiving, witness, and service.
 - b. Proclaim God’s saving Gospel of justification by grace for Christ’s sake through faith alone, according to the apostolic witness in the Holy Scripture, preserving and transmitting the Gospel faithfully to future generations.

- c. Carry out Christ's Great Commission by reaching out to all people to bring them to faith in Christ and by doing all ministry with a global awareness consistent with the understanding of God as Creator, Redeemer, and Sanctifier of all.
- d. Serve in response to God's love to meet human needs, caring for the sick and the aged, advocating dignity, justice, and equity for all people, working for peace and reconciliation among the nations, caring for the marginalized, embracing and welcoming racially and ethnically diverse populations, and standing in solidarity with the poor and oppressed and committing itself to their needs.
- e. Nurture its members in the Word of God so as to grow in faith and hope and love, to see daily life as the primary setting for the exercise of their Christian calling, and to use the gifts of the Spirit for their life together and for their calling in the world.
- f. Manifest the unity given to the people of God by living together in the love of Christ and by joining with other Christians in prayer and action to express and preserve the unity which the Spirit gives.

*C4.03

To fulfill these purposes, this congregation shall:

- a. Provide services of worship at which the Word of God is preached and the sacraments are administered.
- b. Provide pastoral care and assist all members to participate in this ministry.
- c. Challenge, equip, and support all members in carrying out their calling in their daily lives and in their congregation.
- d. Teach the Word of God.
- e. Witness to the reconciling Word of God in Christ, reaching out to all.
- f. Respond to human need, work for justice and peace, care for the sick and the suffering, and participate responsibly in society.
- g. Motivate its members to provide financial support for this congregation's ministry and the ministry of the other expressions of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.
- h. Foster and participate in interdependent relationships with other congregations, the synod, and the churchwide organization of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.
- i. Foster and participate in ecumenical relationships consistent with churchwide policy.

*C4.04

This congregation shall develop an organizational structure to be described in the bylaws. The Congregation Council shall prepare descriptions of the responsibilities of each committee, task force, or other organizational group and shall review their actions. Such descriptions shall be contained in continuing resolutions in the section on the Congregation Council. [Such descriptions shall be contained in the continuing resolutions in the section on the Congregation Committees.]

*C4.05

This congregation shall adopt and periodically review a mission statement which will provide specific direction for its programs.

*C4.06:

References herein to the nature of the relationship between the three expressions of this church – congregations, synods, and the churchwide organization – as being interdependent or as being in a partnership relationship describe the mutual responsibility of these expressions in God's mission and the fulfillment of the purposes

of this church as described in this chapter, and do not imply or describe the creation of partnerships, co-ventures, agencies, or other legal relationships recognized in civil law.

Chapter 5 POWERS OF THE CHURCH

- *C5.01 The powers of this congregation are those necessary to fulfill its purpose.
- *C5.02 The powers of this congregation are vested in the Congregation Meeting called and conducted as provided in this constitution and bylaws.
- *C5.03 Only such authority as is delegated to the Congregation Council or other organizational units in this congregation's governing documents is recognized. All remaining authority is retained by the congregation.
- The congregation is authorized to:
- a. call a pastor as provided in Chapter 9;
 - b. terminate the call of a pastor as provided in Chapter 9;
 - c. call a minister of Word and Service;
 - d. terminate the call of a minister of Word and Service in conformity with the constitution of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America;
 - e. adopt amendments to the constitution, as provided in Chapter 16, amendments to the bylaws, as specified in Chapter 17, and continuing resolutions, as provided in Chapter 18;
 - f. approve the annual budget;
 - g. acquire real and personal property by gift, devise, purchase, or other lawful means;
 - h. hold title to and use its property for any and all activities consistent with its purpose;
 - i. sell, mortgage, lease, transfer, or otherwise dispose of its property by any lawful means;
 - j. elect its [officers][,] [and] Congregation Council, [boards, and committees,] and require [them] [the members of the council] to carry out their duties in accordance with the constitution[,] [and] bylaws[,] [and continuing resolutions]; and
 - k. terminate its relationship with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America as provided in Chapter 6.
- *C5.04 This congregation shall elect from among its voting members laypersons to serve as voting members of the Synod Assembly as well as persons to represent it at meetings of any conference, cluster, coalition, or other area subdivision of which it is a member. The number of persons to be elected by the congregation and other qualifications shall be prescribed in guidelines established by the Northeastern Iowa Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.
- C5.05 This congregation shall have a mission endowment fund that will operate as specified in this congregation's [bylaws][continuing resolutions]. The purpose of the missing endowment fund is to provide for mission work beyond the operational budget of this congregation.

Chapter 6 CHURCH AFFILIATION

- *C6.01 This congregation shall be an interdependent part of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America or its successor, and of the Northeastern Iowa Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. This congregation is subject to the discipline of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.
- *C6.02 This congregation accepts the Confession of Faith and agrees to the purposes of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and shall act in accordance with them.
- *C6.03 This congregation acknowledges its relationship with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America which:
- a. The congregation agrees to be responsible for its life as a Christian community.
 - b. This congregation pledges its financial support and participation in the life and mission of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.
 - c. This congregation agrees to call pastoral leadership from the roster of Ministers of Word and Sacrament of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America in accordance with its call procedures except in special circumstances and with the approval of the bishop of the synod. These special circumstances are limited either to calling a candidate approved for the roster of Ministers of Word and Sacrament of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America or to contracting for pastoral services with a minister of Word and Sacrament of a church body with which the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America officially has established a relationship of full communion.
 - d. This congregation agrees to consider ministers of Word and Service for call to other staff positions in this congregation according to the procedures of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.
 - e. This congregation agrees to file this constitution and any subsequent changes to this constitution with the synod for review to ascertain that all of its provisions are in agreement with the constitution and bylaws of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and with the constitution of the synod.
- *C6.04 Affiliation with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America is terminated as follows:
- a. This congregation takes action to dissolve.
 - b. This congregation ceases to exist.
 - c. This congregation is removed from membership in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America according to the procedures for discipline of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America according to the procedures for discipline of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America or in accordance with provision 9.23. of the constitution and bylaws of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.
 - d. The Northeastern Iowa Synod takes charge and control of the property of this congregation to hold, manage, and convey the same on behalf of the synod pursuant to †S13.24 of the synod constitution. This congregation shall have the right to appeal the decision to the next Synod Assembly.
 - e. This congregation follows the procedures outlined in C6.05.
- *C6.05 This congregation may terminate its relationship with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America by the following procedure:

- a. A resolution indicating the intent to terminate its relationship must be adopted at two legally called and conducted special meetings of this congregation by a two-thirds vote of the voting members present at each meeting. The first such meeting may be held no sooner than 30 days after written notice of the meeting is received by the bishop of the synod, during which time this congregation shall consult with the bishop and the bishop's designees, if any. The times and manner of the consultation shall be determined by the bishop in consultation with the Congregation Council. Unless the bishop and/or the bishop's designees are voting members of this congregation, they shall have voice but not vote at the first meeting.
- b. Within 10 days after the resolution has been voted upon at the first meeting, the secretary of this congregation shall submit a copy of the resolution to the bishop, attesting that the special meeting was legally called and conducted and certifying the outcome of the vote, and shall send copies of the resolution and certification to voting members of this congregation.
- c. If the resolution was adopted by a two-thirds vote of the voting members present at the first meeting, the bishop of the synod and this congregation shall continue in consultation, as specified in paragraph a. above, during a period of at least 90 days after receipt by the bishop of the attestation and certification as specified in paragraph b. above.
- d. If this congregation, after such consultation, is still considering termination of its relationship with this church, such action may be taken at a legally called and conducted special meeting by a two-thirds vote of the voting members present. Notice of the second meeting shall be sent to all voting members and to the bishop at least 10 days in advance of the meeting. Unless the bishop and/or the bishop's designees are voting members of this congregation, they shall have voice but not vote at the second meeting.
- e. Within 10 days after the resolution has been voted upon, the secretary of this congregation shall submit a copy of the resolution to the bishop, attesting that the second special meeting was legally called and conducted and certifying the outcome of the vote, and shall send copies of the resolution and certification to the voting members of the congregation. If the resolution was adopted by a two-thirds vote of the voting members present at the second meeting, the relationship between the congregation and this church shall be terminated subject to Synod Council approval as required by paragraphs f. and g. below.
- f. Unless this notification to the bishop also certifies that this congregation has voted to affiliate with another Lutheran denomination, this congregation shall be deemed an independent or non-Lutheran church, in which case *C7.04. shall apply.
- g. This congregation shall abide by these covenants by and among the three expressions of this church:
 - 1) Congregations seeking to terminate their relationship with this church which fail or refuse to comply with each of the foregoing provisions in *C6.05 shall be required to receive Synod Council approval before terminating their membership in this church.
 - 2) Congregations which had been members of the Lutheran Church in America shall be required, in addition to complying with the foregoing provisions in

*C6.05, to receive synod approval before terminating their membership in this church.

- 3) Congregations established by the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America shall be required, in addition to complying with the foregoing provisions in *C6.05., to satisfy all financial obligations to this church and receive Synod Council approval before terminating their membership in this church.
- h. If this congregation fails to achieve the required two-thirds vote of voting members present at this congregation's first meeting as specified in paragraph a. above or fails to achieve the required two-thirds vote of voting members present at this congregation's second meeting as specified in paragraph d. above, another attempt to consider termination of relationship with this church must follow all requirements of *C6.05. and may begin no sooner than six months after the meeting at which the two-thirds vote was not achieved.

*C6.06 If this congregation considers relocation, it shall confer with the bishop of the synod in which it is territorially located and the appropriate unit of the churchwide organization before any steps are taken leading to such action. The approval of the Synod Council shall be received before any such action is taken.

*C6.07 If this congregation considers developing an additional site to be used regularly for worship, it shall confer with the bishop of the synod it is territorially located and the appropriate unit of the churchwide organization before any steps are taken leading to such action.

Chapter 7 PROPERTY OWNERSHIP

*C7.01 If this congregation ceases to exist, title to undisposed property shall pass to the Northeastern Iowa Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.

*C7.02 If this congregation is removed from membership in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America according to its procedure for discipline or pursuant to 9.23. of the constitution and bylaws of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, title to property shall continue to reside in this congregation.

*C7.03 If the voting members of this congregation present at a legally called and conducted special meeting of this congregation vote to transfer to another Lutheran church body, title to property shall continue to reside in this congregation, provided the process for termination of relationship in *C6.05. has been followed. Before this congregation takes action to transfer to another Lutheran church body, it shall consult with representatives of the Northeastern Iowa Synod.

*C7.04 If the voting members of this congregation present at a legally called and conducted special meeting of this congregation vote to become independent or relate to a non-Lutheran church body and have followed the process for termination of relationship in *C6.05., title to property of this congregation shall continue to reside in this congregation only with the consent of the Synod Council. The Synod Council, after consultation with this congregation by the process established by the synod, may give approval to the request to become independent or to relate to a non-Lutheran church body, in which case title shall remain with the majority of this congregation. If the Synod Council fails to give such approval, title shall remain with those members who

desire to continue as a congregation of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. In neither case does title to this congregation's property transfer to the synod.

*C7.05 Notwithstanding the provisions of *C7.02. and *C7.03. above, where this congregation has received property from the synod pursuant to a deed or other instrument containing restrictions under provisions 9.71.a of the *Constitution, Bylaws, and Continuing Resolution of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America*, this congregation accepts such restrictions and:

- a. Shall not transfer, encumber, mortgage, or in any way burden or impair any right, title, or interest in the property without prior approval of the Synod Council.
- b. Shall - upon written demand by the Synod Council, pursuant to †S13.23. of the constitution of the Northeastern Iowan Synod —reconvey and transfer all right, title, and interest in the property to the synod.

Chapter 8 MEMBERSHIP

*C8.01 Members of this congregation shall be those baptized persons on the roll of this congregation at the time that this constitution is adopted and those who are admitted thereafter and who have declared and maintained their membership in accordance with the provisions of this constitution and its bylaws.

*C8.02 Members shall be classified as follows:

- a. **Baptized** members are those persons who have been received by the Sacrament of Holy Baptism in this congregation, or, having been previously baptized in the name of the Triune God, have been received by certificate of transfer from other Lutheran congregations or by affirmation of faith.
- b. **Confirmed** members are baptized persons who have been confirmed in this congregation, those who have been received by adult baptism or by transfer as confirmed members from other Lutheran congregations, or baptized persons received by affirmation of faith.
- c. **Voting** members are confirmed members. Such confirmed members, during the current or preceding calendar year, shall have communed in this congregation and shall have made a contribution of record to this congregation. Members of this congregation who have satisfied these basic standards shall have the privilege of voice and vote at every regular and special meeting of this congregation as well as the other rights and privileges ascribed to voting members by the provisions of this constitution and its bylaws. They shall not have voted as a seasonal member of another congregation of this church in the previous two calendar months.
- d. **Associate** members are persons holding membership in other [ELCA] [Lutheran] [Christian] congregations who wish to retain such membership but desire to participate in the life and mission of this congregation. These individuals have all the privileges and duties of membership except voting rights or other rights and privileges ascribed to voting members by the provisions of this constitution and its bylaws.
- e. **Seasonal** members are voting members of other congregations of this church who wish to retain such membership but desire to participate in the life and mission of this congregation, including exercising limited voting rights in this congregation. The

Congregation Council may grant seasonal membership to such persons provided that this congregation is a member of a synod where the Synod Council has approved seasonal member voting on its territory. Such seasonal members shall have all the privileges and duties of voting members except that:

- 1) they shall not be eligible for elected office in, or for membership on the Congregation Council or on a call committee of, this congregation;
- 2) they shall not have the right to vote on any matter concerning or affecting the call or termination of call of any minister of this congregation;
- 3) they shall not have the right to vote on any matter concerning or affecting the affiliation of this congregation with this church;
- 4) they shall not be eligible to serve as voting members from this congregation of the Synod Assembly or the Churchwide Assembly;
- 5) they shall not, even if otherwise permitted by this congregation, vote by proxy or by absentee ballot; and
- 6) they shall not, within any two calendar month period, exercise voting rights in this congregation and in the congregation where they remain voting members.

*C8.03 All applications for confirmed membership shall be submitted to and shall require the approval of the Congregation Council.

*C8.04 It shall be the privilege and duty of members of this congregation to:

- a. make regular use of the means of grace, both Word and sacraments;
- b. live a Christian life in accordance with the Word of God and the teachings of the Lutheran church; and;
- c. support the work of this congregation, the synod, and the churchwide organization of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America through contributions of their time, abilities, and financial support as biblical stewards.

*C8.05 Membership in this congregation shall be terminated by any of the following:

- a. death;
- b. resignation;
- c. transfer or release;
- d. disciplinary action in accordance with Chapter 20 of the constitution and bylaws of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America; or
- e. removal from the roll due to inactivity in accordance with the provisions of this constitution and its bylaws.

Such persons who have been removed from the roll of members shall remain persons for whom the Church has a continuing pastoral concern.

Chapter 9 ROSTERED MINISTER

*C9.01 Authority to call a pastor shall be in this congregation by at least a two-thirds vote of voting members present and voting at a meeting legally called for that purpose. Before a call is issued, the officers, or a committee elected by [this congregation][the Congregation Council] to recommend the call, shall seek the advice and help of the bishop of the synod.

- *C9.02 Only a member of the roster of Ministers of Word and Sacrament of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America or a candidate for the roster of Ministers of Word and Sacrament who has been recommended for this congregation by the synod bishop may be called as a pastor of this congregation.
- *C9.03 Consistent with the faith and practice of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America,
- a. Every minister of Word and Sacrament shall:
 1. preach the Word;
 2. administer the sacraments;
 3. conduct public worship;
 4. provide pastoral care;
 5. seek out and encourage qualified persons to prepare for the ministry of the Gospel;
 6. impart knowledge of this church and its wider ministry through available channels of effective communication;
 7. witness to the Kingdom of God in the community, in the nation, and abroad; and
 8. speak publicly to the world in solidarity with the poor and oppressed, advocating dignity, justice, and equity for all people, working for peace and reconciliation among nations, caring for the marginalized, and embracing and welcoming racially and ethnically diverse populations.
 - b. Each pastor with a congregation shall, within the congregation;
 1. offer instruction, confirm, marry, visit the sick and distressed, and bury the dead;
 2. relate to all schools and organizations of this congregation;
 3. install regularly elected members of the Congregation Council;
 4. with the council, administer discipline;
 5. endeavor to increase the support given by the congregation to the work of the churchwide organization and of the Northeastern Iowa Synod; and
 6. encourage adherence to covenantal relationship with this church as expressed in the *Constitutions, Bylaws, and Continuing Resolutions of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America*.
- *C9.04 The specific duties of the pastor, compensation, and other matters pertaining to the service of the pastor shall be included in a letter of call, which shall be attested by the bishop of the synod.
- *C9.05 The provisions for termination of the mutual relationship between a minister of Word and Sacrament and this congregation shall be as follows:
- a. The call of this congregation, when accepted by a pastor, shall constitute a continuing mutual relationship and commitment, which shall be terminated only by the pastor's death or, following consultation with the synod bishop, for any of the following reasons:
 1. mutual agreement to terminate the call or the completion of a call for a specific term;
 2. resignation of the pastor, which shall become effective, unless otherwise agreed, no later than 30 days after the date on which it was submitted;
 3. inability to conduct the pastoral office effectively in this congregation in view of local conditions;

4. inability to conduct the pastoral office effectively in view of disability or incapacity of the pastor;
 5. suspension of the pastor through discipline for more than three months;
 6. resignation or removal of the pastor from the roster of Ministers of Word and Sacrament of this church;
 7. termination of the relationship between this church and this congregation;
 8. dissolution of this congregation or the termination of a parish arrangement; or
 9. suspension of this congregation through discipline for more than six months.
- b. When allegations of disability or incapacity of the pastor under paragraph a.4. above, or ineffective conduct of the pastoral office under paragraph a.3. above, have come to the attention of the bishop of this synod,
 1. the bishop, who has sole discretion, may investigate such conditions personally together with a committee of two rostered ministers and one layperson, or
 2. when such allegations have been brought to the synod's attention by an official recital of allegations by the Congregation Council or by a petition signed by at least one-third of the voting members of this congregation, the bishop personally shall investigate such conditions together with a committee of two rostered ministers and one layperson.
 - c. In case of alleged disability or incapacity under paragraph a.4 above, the bishop's committee shall obtain and document competent medical opinion concerning the pastor's condition. When a disability or incapacity is evident to the committee, the bishop of this synod may declare the pastorate vacant. When the pastorate is declared vacant, the Synod Council shall list the pastor on the roster of Ministers of Word and Sacrament with disability status. Upon resumption of the ability to conduct the office effectively, the bishop shall take steps to enable the pastor to resume the ministry, either in the congregation last served or in another appropriate call.
 - d. In the case of alleged local difficulties that imperil the effective functioning of this congregation under paragraph a.3 above, the persons, after which the bishop together with the committee shall present their recommendations first to the pastor and then to this congregation. The recommendations of the bishop's committee must address whether the pastor's call should come to an end and, if so, may suggest appropriate severance arrangements. The committee may also propose other actions that should be undertaken by this congregation and by the pastor, if appropriate. If the pastor and congregation agree to carry out such recommendations, no further action need be taken by the synod.
 - e. If either party fails to assent to the recommendations of the bishop's committee concerning the pastor's call, this congregation may dismiss the pastor only at a legally called meeting after consultation with the bishop, either (a) by a two-thirds vote of the voting members present and voting where the bishop and the committee did not recommend termination of the call, or (b) by a majority vote of the voting members present and voting where the bishop and the committee recommended termination of the call.
 - f. If, in the course of proceedings described in paragraph c. or paragraph d. above, the bishop's committee concludes that there may be grounds for discipline, the committee shall make recommendations concerning disciplinary action in

accordance with the provisions of this church's constitution, bylaws, and continuing resolutions.

- *C9.06 At a time of pastoral vacancy, an interim pastor shall be appointed by the bishop of the synod with the consent of this congregation or the Congregation Council.
- *C9.07 During the period of service, an interim pastor shall have the rights and duties in this congregation of a regularly called pastor and may delegate the same in part to a supply pastor with the consent of the bishop of the synod and this congregation or Congregation Council. The interim pastor and any rostered minister providing assistance shall refrain from exerting influence in the selection of a pastor. Unless previously agreed upon by the Synod Council, an interim pastor is not available for a regular call to the congregation served.
- *C9.08 This congregation shall make satisfactory settlement of all financial obligations to a former pastor before calling a successor. A pastor shall make satisfactory settlement of all financial obligations to this congregation before beginning service in a call to another congregation or employment in another ministry setting.
- *C9.09 When a pastor is called to serve in company with another pastor or pastors, the privileges and responsibilities of each pastor shall be specified in documents to accompany the call and to be drafted in consultation involving the pastors, the Congregation Council, and the bishop of the synod. As occasion requires, the documents may be revised through a similar consultation.
- *C9.11 With the approval of the bishop of the synod, this congregation may depart from *C9.05.a and call a pastor for a specific term. Details of such calls shall be in writing setting forth the purpose and conditions involved. Prior to the completion of a term, the bishop or a designated representative of the bishop shall meet with the pastor and representatives of this congregation for a review of the call. Such a call may also be terminated before its expiration in accordance with the provisions of *C9.05.a.
- *C9.12 The pastor of this congregation:
 - a. shall keep accurate records of all baptisms, confirmations, marriages, burials, communicants, members received, members dismissed, or members excluded from this congregation;
 - b. shall submit a summary of such statistics annually to the synod; and
 - c. shall become a member of this congregation upon receipt and acceptance of the letter of call. In a parish of multiple congregations, the pastor shall hold membership in one of the congregations.
- *C9.13 The pastor(s) shall submit a report of ministry to the bishop of the synod at least 90 days prior to each regular meeting of the Synod Assembly.
- *C9.14 The records of this congregation shall be maintained by the pastor and shall remain the property of the congregation. The secretary of this congregation shall attest in writing to the bishop of this synod that such records have been placed in the secretary's hands in good order by a departing pastor before the installation of that pastor in another call or approval of a request for change in roster status.
- C9.15 Under special, subject to the approval of the synod bishop and the concurrence of this congregation, a minister of Word and Sacrament of a church body with which the

Evangelical Lutheran Church in America officially has established a relationship of full communion may serve temporarily as past or this congregation under a contract between this congregation and the pastor in a form proposed by the synod bishop and approved by this congregation.

- *C9.21 Authority to call a deacon shall be in this congregation by at least a two-thirds vote of voting members present and voting at a meeting legally called for that purpose. Before a call is issued, the officers, or a committee elected by [this congregation] [the Congregation Council] to recommend the call, shall seek the advice and help of the bishop of the synod.
- *C9.22 Only a member of the roster of Ministers or Word and Service of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America or a candidate for the roster of Ministers of Word and Service who has been recommended for this congregation by the synod bishop may be called as a deacon of this congregation.
- *C9.23 Consistent with the faith and practice of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, every minister of Word and Service shall:
- a. Be rooted in the Word of God, for proclamation and service;
 - b. Advocate a prophetic diakonia that commits itself to risk-taking and innovative service on the frontiers of the Church's outreach, giving particular attention to the suffering places in God's world;
 - c. Speak publicly to the world in solidarity with the poor and oppressed, advocating dignity, justice, and equity for all people, working for peace and reconciliation among the nations, caring for the marginalized, and embracing and welcoming racially and ethnically diverse populations;
 - d. Equip the baptized for ministry in God's world that affirms the gifts of all people;
 - e. Encourage mutual relationships that invite participation and accompaniment of others in God's mission;
 - f. Practice stewardship that respects God's gift of time, talents, and resources;
 - g. Be grounded in a gathered community for ongoing diaconal formation;
 - h. Share knowledge of this church and its wider ministry of the gospel and advocate for the work of all expressions of this church; and
 - i. Identify and encourage qualified persons to prepare for ministry of the gospel.
- *C9.24 The specific duties of the deacon, compensation, and other matters pertaining to the service of the deacon shall be included in a letter of call, which shall be attested by the bishop of the synod.
- *C9.25 The provisions for termination of the mutual relationship between a minister of Word and Service and this congregation shall be as follows:
- a. The call of this congregation, when accepted by a deacon, shall constitute a continuing mutual relationship and commitment, which shall be terminated only by the deacon's death or, following consultation with the synod bishop, for any of the following reasons:
 1. mutual agreement to terminate the fall or the completion of a call for a specific term;
 2. resignation of the deacon, which shall become effective, unless otherwise agreed, no later than 30 days after the date on which it was submitted;

3. inability to conduct the ministry of Word and Service effectively in this congregation in view of local conditions;
 4. inability to conduct the office effectively in view of disability or incapacity of the deacon;
 5. suspension of the deacon through discipline for more than three months; 6) resignation or removal of the deacon from the roster of Ministers of Word and Service of this church;
 6. resignation or removal of the deacon from the roster of Ministers of Word and Service of this church;
 7. termination of the relationship between this church and this congregation;
 8. dissolution of this congregation or the termination of a parish arrangement;
 9. suspension of this congregation through discipline for more than six months.
- b. When allegations of disability or incapacity of the deacon under paragraph a.4 above, or ineffective conduct of the office of minister of Word and Service under paragraph a.3 above, have come to the attention of the bishop of this synod,
 1. the bishop, who has sole discretion, may investigate such conditions personally together with a committee of two rostered ministers and one layperson, or
 2. when such allegations have been brought to the synod's attention by an official recital of allegations by the Congregation Council or by a petition signed by at least one-third of the voting members of this congregation, the bishop personally shall investigate such conditions together with a committee of two rostered ministers and one layperson
 - c. In case of alleged disability or incapacity under paragraph a.4) above, the bishop's committee shall obtain and document competent medical opinion concerning the deacon's condition. When a disability or incapacity is evident to the committee, the bishop of this synod may declare the position vacant. When the position is declared vacant, the Synod Council shall list the deacon on the roster of Ministers of Word and Service with disability status. Upon resumption of the ability to conduct the office effectively, the bishop shall take steps to enable the deacon to resume the ministry, either in the congregation last served or in another appropriate call.
 - d. In the case of alleged local difficulties that imperil the effective functioning of this congregation under paragraph a.3) above, the bishop's committee shall endeavor to hear from all concerned persons, after which the bishop together with the committee shall present their recommendations first to the deacon and then to this congregation. The recommendations of the bishop's committee must address whether the deacon's call should come to an end and, if so, may suggest appropriate severance arrangements. The committee may also propose other actions that should be undertaken by this congregation and by the deacon, if appropriate. If the deacon and congregation agree to carry out such recommendations, no further action need be taken by the synod.
 - e. If either party fails to assent to the recommendation so the bishop's committee concerning the deacon's call, this congregation may discuss the deacon only at a legally called meeting after consultation with the bishop, either (a) by a two-thirds vote of the voting members present and voting where the bishop and the committee did not recommend termination of the call, or (b) by a majority vote of

the voting members present and voting where the bishop and the committee recommended termination of the call.

- f. If, in the course of proceedings described in paragraph c. or paragraph d. above, the bishop's committee concludes that there may be grounds for discipline, the committee shall make recommendations concerning disciplinary action in accordance with the provisions of this church's constitution, bylaws, and continuing resolutions.

- *C9.26 This congregation shall make satisfactory settlement of all financial obligations to a former deacon before calling a successor. A deacon shall make satisfactory settlement of all financial obligations to this congregation before beginning service in a call to another congregation or employment in another ministry setting.
- *C9.27 When a deacon is called to serve in company with another rostered minister or other rostered ministers, the privileges and responsibilities of each rostered minister shall be specified in documents to accompany the call and to be drafted in consultation involving the rostered ministers, the Congregation Council, and the bishop of the synod. As occasion requires, the documents may be revised through a similar consultation.
- *C9.28 With the approval of the bishop of the synod, this congregation may depart from *C9.25.a. and call a deacon for a specific term. Details of such calls shall be in writing setting forth the purpose and conditions involved. Prior to the completion of a term, the bishop or a designated representative of the bishop shall meet with the deacon and representatives of this congregation for a review of the call. Such a call may also be terminated before its expiration in accordance with the provisions of *C9.25.a.
- C9.29 The deacon shall become a member of this congregation upon receipt and acceptance of the letter of call. In a parish of multiple congregations, the deacon shall hold membership in one of the congregations.
- *C9.31 The deacon(s) shall submit a report of ministry to the bishop of the synod at least 90 days prior to each regular meeting of the Synod Assembly.

Chapter 10 CONGREGATION MEETING

- C10.01 The annual meeting of this congregation shall be held at a time specified in the bylaws.
- C10.02 A special Congregation Meeting may be called by the pastor, the Congregation Council, or the president of this congregation, and shall be called by the president of the congregation upon the written request of 75 of the voting members. The call for each special meeting shall specify the purpose of which it is to be held and no other business shall be transacted.
- C10.03 Notice of all meetings of this congregation shall be given at the services of worship on the preceding two consecutive Sundays and by mail or electronic means, as permitted by state law, to all [voting] members at least 10 days in advance of the date of the meeting.
- C10.04 75 voting members shall constitute a quorum.
- C10.05 Voting by proxy or absentee ballot shall not be permitted.

- C10.06 All actions approved by this congregation shall be by majority vote of those voting members present and voting, except as otherwise provided in this constitution or by state law.
- C10.07 *Robert's Rules of Order*, latest edition, shall govern all parliamentary procedure of all meetings of this congregation.
- C10.08 This congregation may hold meetings by remote communication, including electronically and by telephone conference, as long as there is an opportunity for simultaneous aural communication or its equivalent. To the extent permitted by state law, notice of all meetings may be provided electronically.
- C10.09 "*Ex officio*" as used herein means membership with full rights of voice and vote unless otherwise expressly limited.

Chapter 11 OFFICERS

- C11.01 The officers of this congregation shall be president, vice president, secretary, and treasurer.
- a. Duties of the officers shall be specified in the bylaws.
 - b. The officers shall be voting members of this congregation.
 - c. Officers of this congregation shall serve similar offices of the Congregation Council and shall be voting members of the Congregation Council.
 - d. If the Congregation Council elects its officers, the president, vice president, and secretary shall be selected from the elected membership of the Congregation Council. [If the treasurer is not selected from the elected membership of the Congregation Council, the treasurer shall have voice but not vote at the meetings of the Congregation Council.]
 - e. The Congregation Council shall elect a treasurer and a financial secretary who are not members of the Congregation Council.
- C11.02 The Congregation Council shall elect its officers, and they shall be the officers of the congregation. The officers shall be elected by written ballot and shall serve for one year or until their successors are elected. Their terms shall begin at the close of the annual meeting at which they are elected.
- C11.03 No officer shall hold more than one office at a time. No elected officer shall be eligible to serve more than two consecutive terms in the same office.

Chapter 12 CONGREGATION COUNCIL

- C12.01 The voting membership of the Congregation Council shall consist of the pastor(s), and not more or fewer than nine (9) congregational members. Any voting member of the congregation may be elected, subject only to the limitation on the length of continuous service permitted in that office. A member's place on the Congregation Council shall be declared vacant if the member a) ceases to be a voting member of this congregation or b) is absent from four successive regular meetings of the Congregation Council without cause. Consistent with the laws of the state in which the congregation is incorporated, the congregation may adopt procedures for the removal of a member of the Congregation Council in other circumstances.

- C12.02 The members of the Congregation Council shall be elected by written ballot to serve for 3 years or until their successors are elected. Such members shall be eligible to serve no more than two full terms consecutively. Their term shall begin at the close of the annual meeting at which they are elected.
- C12.03 Should a member's place on the Congregation Council be declared vacant, the Congregation Council shall elect, by majority vote, a successor to fill the unexpired term of the member.
- C12.04 The Congregation Council shall have general oversight of the life and activities of this congregation, and in particular its worship life, to the end that everything be done in accordance with the Word of God and the faith and practice of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. The duties of the Congregation Council shall include the following:
- a. To lead this congregation in stating its mission, to do long-range planning, to set goals and priorities, and to evaluate its activities in light of its mission and goals.
 - b. To seek to involve all members of this congregation in worship, learning, witness, service, and support.
 - c. To oversee and provide for the administration of this congregation to enable it to fulfill its functions and perform its mission.
 - d. To maintain supportive relationships with the rostered minister(s) and staff and help them annually to evaluate the fulfillment of their calling or employment.
 - e. To be examples individually and corporately of the style of life and minister expected of all baptized persons.
 - f. To promote a congregational climate of peace and goodwill, and, as differences and conflicts arise, to endeavor to foster mutual understanding.
 - g. To arrange for pastoral service during sickness or absence of the pastor.
 - h. To emphasize partnership with the synod and churchwide organization of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America as well as cooperation with other congregations, both Lutheran and non-Lutheran, subject to the established policies of the synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.
 - i. To recommend and encourage the use of program resources produced or approved the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.
 - j. To seek out and encourage qualified persons to prepare for the ministry of the Gospel.
- C12.05 This Congregation Council shall be responsible for the financial and property matters of this congregation.
- a. This Congregation Council shall be the board of directors of this congregation, and as such, shall be responsible for maintaining and protecting its property and managing its business and fiscal affairs. It shall have the powers and be subject to the obligations that pertain to such boards under the laws of the State of Iowa, except as otherwise provided herein, to be subject to the obligations that pertain to such boards under the laws of the State of Iowa, except as otherwise provided herein.
 - b. The Congregation Council shall not have the authority to buy, sell, or encumber real property unless specifically authorized to do so by a meeting of the congregation.

- c. The congregation may enter into contracts of up to \$2,500 for items not included in the budget.
- d. The Congregation Council shall prepare an annual budget for adoption by this congregation, shall supervise the expenditure of funds in accordance therewithin following its adoption, and may incur obligations of more than \$2,500 in excess of the anticipated receipts only after approval by Congregation Meeting. The budget shall include this congregation's full indicated share in support of the wider ministry being carried on in collaboration with the synod and churchwide organization.
- e. The Congregation Council shall ascertain that the financial affairs of this congregation are being conducted efficiently, giving particular attention to the prompt payment of all obligations and to the regular forwarding of mission support monies to the synod.
- f. The Congregation Council shall be responsible for this congregation's investments and its total insurance program.

- C12.06 The Congregation Council shall see that the provisions of this constitution, its bylaws, and the continuing resolutions are carried out.
- C12.07 The Congregation Council shall provide for an annual review of the membership roster.
- C12.08 The Congregation Council shall be responsible for the employment and supervision of the staff of this congregation.
- C12.09 The Congregation Council shall submit a comprehensive report to this congregation at the annual meeting.
- C12.11 The Congregation shall normally meet once a month. Special meetings may be called by the pastor or the president and shall be called by the president at the request of at least one-half of its members. Notice of each special meeting shall be given to all who are entitled to be present.
- C12.12 A quorum for the transaction of business shall consist of a majority of the members of the Congregation Council.
- C12.13 The Congregation Council and its committees may hold meetings by remote communication, including electronically and by telephone conference, as long as there is an opportunity for simultaneous aural communication or its equivalent. To the extent permitted by state law, notice of all meetings may be provided electronically.

Chapter 13 CONGREGATION COMMITTEES

- C13.01 The officers of this congregation and the pastor shall constitute the Executive Committee.
- C13.02 A Nominating Committee of six voting members of this congregation, two of whom, if possible, shall be outgoing members of the Congregation Council, shall be elected at the annual meeting for a term of one year. Members of the Nominating Committee are not eligible for consecutive re-election.
- C13.03 An Audit Committee of three voting members shall be elected by the Congregation Council. Audit Committee members shall not be members of the Congregation

Council. Term of office shall be three years, with one member elected each year. Members shall be eligible for re-election.

- C13.04 Mutual Ministry Committee(s) (in the absence of a mutual ministry committee, the duties shall be fulfilled by the executive committee) shall be appointed jointly by the president [vice president] and the rostered minister. Term of office shall be two years, with three members to be appointed each successive year.
- C13.05 When a pastoral vacancy occurs, a Call Committee of six voting members shall be elected by the Congregation Council. Term of office will terminate upon installation of the newly called pastor.
- C13.06 Other committees of this congregation may be formed, as the need arises, by decision of the Congregation Council.
- C13.07 Duties of committees of this congregation shall be specified in the bylaws and continuing resolutions.
- C13.08 The [senior] pastor of this congregation shall be ex officio a member of all committees and boards of this congregation. The president of this congregation shall be ex officio a member of all committees and boards of the congregation, except the Nominating Committee.

Chapter 14 ORGANIZATIONS WITHIN THE CONGREGATION

- C14.01 All organizations within this congregation shall exist to aid it in ministering to the members of this congregation and to all persons who can be reached with the Gospel of Christ. As outgrowths and expressions of this congregation's life, the organizations are subject to its oversight and direction. This congregation at its meeting shall determine their policies, guide their activities, and receive reports concerning their membership, work, and finances.
- C14.02 Special interest groups, other than those of the official organizations of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, may be organized only after authorization has been given by the Congregation Council and specified in a continuing resolution.

Chapter 15 DISCIPLINE OF MEMBERS AND ADJUDICATION

- *C15.01 Persistent and public denial of the Christian faith, willful or criminal conduct grossly unbecoming a member of the Church of Christ, continual and intentional interference with the ministry of this congregation, or willful and repeated harassment or defamation of member(s) of this congregation is sufficient cause for discipline of a member. Prior to disciplinary action, reconciliation and repentance will be attempted following Matthew 18:15-17, proceeding through these successive steps, as necessary: a) private counsel and admonition by the pastor, b) censure and admonition by the pastor in the presence of two or three witnesses, c) written referral of the matter by the Congregation Council to the vice president of the synod, who will refer it to a consultation panel drawn from the Consultation Committee of the synod, and d) written referral of the matter by the consultation panel to the Committee on Discipline of the synod. If, for any reason, the pastor is unable to administer the

admonitions required by paragraphs a. and b. hereof, those steps may be performed by another pastor chosen by the Executive Committee of the Congregation Council.

- *C15.02 The process for discipline of a member of this congregation shall be governed as prescribed by the chapter on discipline in the *Constitution, Bylaws, and Continuing Resolutions of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America*. If the counseling, censure, and admonitions pursuant to *C15.01 do not result in repentance and amendment of life, charges against the accused member(s) that are specific and in writing may be prepared by the Congregation Council, signed, and submitted to the vice president of the synod. The vice president shall select from the synod's Consultation Committee a panel of five members (three laypersons and two rostered ministers). A copy of the written charges shall be provided to the consultation panel and the accused member(s). The consultation panel, after requesting a written reply to the charges from the accused member(s), shall consider the matter and seek a resolution by means of investigation, consultation, mediation, or whatever other means may seem appropriate. The panel's efforts to reach a mutually agreeable resolution shall continue for no more than 45 days after the matter is submitted to it.
- *C15.03 If the consultation fails to resolve the matter, that panel shall refer the case in writing, including the written charges and the accused member's reply, to the Committee on Discipline of the synod for a hearing. A copy of the panel's written referral shall be delivered to the vice president of the synod, the Congregation Council, and the accused member(s) at the same time it is sent to the Committee on Discipline of the synod. The Executive Committee of the Synod Council shall then select six members from the Committee on Discipline to decide the case and shall appoint a member of the Synod Council to preside as nonvoting chair. Those six members, plus the nonvoting chair, comprise the discipline hearing panel for deciding the case. The Congregation Council and the accused member(s) are the parties to the case.
- *C15.04 The discipline hearing panel shall commence and conduct the disciplinary hearing in accordance with the provisions governing discipline of congregation members prescribed in the *Constitution, Bylaws, and Continuing Resolutions of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America*.
- *C15.05 By the vote of at least two-thirds of the members of the discipline hearing panel who are present and voting, one of the following disciplinary sanctions can be imposed:
- a. suspension from privileges of congregation membership for a designated period of time;
 - b. suspension from the privileges of congregation membership until the pastor and Congregation Council receive evidence, satisfactory to them, of repentance and amendment of life;
 - c. termination of membership in this congregation; or
 - d. termination of membership in this congregation and exclusion from the church property and from all congregation activities.
- *C15.06 The written decision of the discipline hearing panel shall be sent to the vice president of the synod, the accused member(s), and the Congregation Council as required by the *Constitution, Bylaws, and Continuing Resolutions of the Evangelical Lutheran Church*

in America. The decision of the discipline hearing panel shall be implemented by the Congregation Council and recorded in the minutes of the next council meeting.

- *C15.07 No member of this congregation shall be subject to discipline a second time for offenses that a discipline hearing panel has heard previously and decided pursuant to this chapter.
- *C15.10 Adjudication
- C15.10 When there is disagreement between or among factions within this congregation on a substantive issue which cannot be resolved by the parties, members of this congregation may petition the synod bishop for consultation after informing the president [vice president] of this congregation of their intent to do so. The synod bishop shall seek a timely resolution of the dispute. If the issue relates directly to the pastor, the bishop may begin the process in †S14.18.d. In all other matters, if the bishop's consultation fails to resolve the issue, the bishop shall refer the matter to the Consultation Committee of the synod, which shall undertake efforts to find an appropriate solution. If the Consultation Committee's efforts fail to resolve the dispute, the entire matter shall be referred to the Synod Council for adjudication by whatever process the Council deems necessary. The Synod Council's decision shall be final.

Chapter 16 AMENDMENTS

- *C16.01 Unless provision *C16.04. is applicable, those sections of this constitution that are not required, in accord with *the Model Constitution for Congregations of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America*, may be amended in the following manner. Amendments may be proposed by at least 75 voting members or by the Congregation Council. Proposals must be filed in writing with the Congregation Council 60 days before formal consideration by this congregation at a regular or special Congregation Meeting called for that purpose. The Congregation Council shall notify this congregation's members of the proposal together with the council's recommendations at least 30 days in advance of the meeting. Notification may take place by mail or electronic means, as permitted by state law.
- *16.02 An amendment to this constitution, proposed under * C16.01 shall,
- be approved at any legally called meeting of this congregation by a majority vote of those voting members present and voting; and
 - be ratified without change at the next regular meeting of this congregation by a two-thirds vote of those voting members present and voting.
- *16.03 Any amendments to this constitution that result from the processes provided in *C16.01. and *C16.02. shall be sent by the secretary of this congregation to the synod. The synod shall notify this congregation of its decision to approve or disapprove the proposed changes; the changes shall go into effect upon notification that the synod has approved them.
- *16.04 This constitution may be amended to bring any section into conformity with a section or sections, either required or not required, of the *Model Constitution for Congregations of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America* as most recently amended by the Churchwide Assembly. Such amendments may be approved by a

majority vote of those voting members present and voting at any legally called meeting of this congregation without presentation at a prior meeting of this congregation, provided that the Congregation Council has submitted by mail or electronic means, as permitted by state law, notice to this congregation of such an amendment or amendments, together with the council's recommendations, at least 30 days prior to the meeting. Upon the request of at least two (2) voting members of this congregation, the Congregation Council shall submit such notice. Following the adoption of an amendment, the secretary of this congregation shall submit a copy thereof to the synod. Such provisions shall become effective immediately following the congregation's vote of approval.

Chapter 17 BYLAWS

- *C17.01* This congregation may adopt bylaws. No bylaw may conflict with this constitution.
- *C17.02* Bylaws may be adopted or amended at any legally called meeting of this congregation with a quorum present by a two-thirds vote of those voting members present and voting.
- *C17.03 Changes to the bylaws may be proposed by any voting member, provided that such additions or amendments be submitted in writing to the Congregation Council at least 60 days before a regular or special Congregation Meeting called for that purpose. The Congregation Council shall notify this congregation's members of the proposal with the council's recommendations at least 30 days in advance of the Congregation Meeting. Notification may take place by mail or electronic means, as permitted by state law.
- C17.04 Adopted or amended bylaws shall be sent by the secretary of this congregation to the synod.

Chapter 18 CONTINUING RESOLUTIONS

- *C18.01 This congregation in a legally called meeting or the Congregation Council may enact continuing resolutions. Such continuing resolutions may not conflict with the constitution bylaws of this congregation.
- *C18.02 Continuing resolutions shall be enacted or amended by a majority vote of a meeting of this congregation, or a two-thirds vote of all voting members of the Congregation Council.
- *C18.03 Adopted or amended continuing resolutions shall be sent by the secretary of this congregation to the synod.

Chapter 19 INDEMNIFICATION

- *C19.01 Consistent with provisions of the laws under which this congregation is incorporated, this congregation may adopt provisions providing indemnification for each person who, by reason of the fact that such person is or was a Congregation Council member, officer, employee, agent, or other member of any committee of this congregation, was

or is threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending, or completed civil, criminal, administrative, arbitration, or investigative proceeding.

Chapter 20 PARISH AUTHORIZATION

- *C20.01 This congregation may unite with one or more other congregations recognized by the synod named in *C6.01. to form a parish. Except as provided in *C20.02. and *C20.03., a written agreement, developed in consultation with the synod and approved by the voting members of each congregation participating in the parish, shall specify the powers and responsibilities that have been delegated to the Parish Council. The Parish Agreement shall identify which congregation of the parish issues calls on behalf of the member congregations or shall establish a process for identifying which congregation issues calls on behalf of the member congregations.
- *C20.02 One congregation of a parish shall issue a call on behalf of the member congregations to a minister of Word and Sacrament or a candidate for the roster of Ministers of Word and Sacrament who has been recommended by the synod bishop to serve the congregations of the parish. Such a call shall be approved prior to issuance by a two-thirds vote at a congregation meeting of each congregation forming the parish. If any congregation of the parish should fail to approve the call, the other congregations of the parish shall have the right to terminate the parish agreement.
- *C20.03 One congregation of a parish may issue a call on behalf of the member congregations to a minister of Word and Service or a candidate for the roster of Ministers of Word and Service who has been recommended by the synod bishop to serve the congregations of the parish. Such a call shall be approved prior to issuance by a two-thirds vote at a congregation meeting of each congregation forming the parish. If any congregation of the parish should fail to approve the call, the other congregations of the parish shall have the right to terminate the parish agreement.
- *C20.04 Any one of the congregations of the parish may terminate their relationship with the pastor as provided in †S14.18.d. of the synod constitution of the synod named in *C6.01. In such case, the other congregation(s) of the same parish shall have the right to terminate the parish agreement.
- *C20.05 Any one of the congregations of the parish may terminate their relationship with a minister of Word and Service as provided in †S14.43.d. of the synod constitution of the synod named in *C6.01. In such case, the other congregation(s) of the same parish shall have the right to terminate the parish agreement.
- *C20.06 Whenever a parish agreement is terminated, the call of any rostered minister serving that parish is terminated. Should any congregation that was formerly part of the parish agreement desire to issue a new call to that rostered minister, it may do so in accordance with the call process of this church.

BYLAWS TO THE CONSTITUTION OF IMMANUEL LUTHERAN CHURCH OF INDEPENDENCE, IOWA

Part I - Powers

1. All power in the congregation has its source in the Word of God, which is the norm for its faith and life. All individuals and groups within the congregation shall submit to the authority of the Word; and the life and activity of the congregation and its organizations shall conform to it.
2. The powers of the congregation shall be vested in the congregational meeting, called and conducted in such manner as is provided in this constitution, and to the extent conveyed by this constitution or as assigned from time to time by the congregational meeting, in the boards elected by the congregation.
3. In the fulfillment of its purpose, the congregation is empowered to:
 - a. acquire real and personal property by gift, devise, bequest, purchase, or other lawful means;
 - b. hold title to and use its property for any and all activities consistent with its purpose;
 - c. sell, mortgage, lease, transfer, or otherwise dispose of its property by any lawful means;
 - d. enter into contract;
 - e. elect officers and boards for the exercise of their powers and authority and require them to conduct their affairs in accordance with this constitution and its bylaws, and the resolutions of the congregation.
4. Real property shall not be purchased, disposed of, or encumbered in any manner except by resolution adopted by a quorum of 75 members with a majority vote of the members present at a legally called meeting of the congregation.

PART II - Worship

As an expression of the unity of the Church in Christ, the congregation recognizes the desirability of conforming to the practices of other member congregations in using such forms of worship, including liturgies and hymn books, as are recommended by the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.

PART III - Meetings of the Congregation

1. The power of and authority of the congregation shall be exercised throughout the congregational meeting which shall be called and conducted in conformity with civil laws and the provisions of the constitution and bylaws of the congregation.
2. The time and place of the annual meeting of the congregation shall be determined by the Congregation Council. The Congregation Council shall announce the time and place at two public services immediately preceding the meeting, said services to be at least a week apart; and in such publications as the congregation or the pastor(s) may periodically issue, or by written notice to the voting members mailed or by electronic transmission not less than ten (10) days in advance of the meeting.
3. The current roster of voters, confirmed, baptized and associate members shall be available at each annual meeting of the congregation.

4. The annual meeting shall receive reports from all organizations of the congregation. Such reports should be submitted in writing to the church office not less than 20 days before such meeting. The financial statement shall be submitted not less than 14 days before such meeting.
- a. The annual meeting of the congregation shall elect a Nominating Committee of at least three outgoing Congregation Council members. The pastor shall serve as convener and as an advisory member. The term of office of the members of the Nominating Committee shall be one year. The Nominating Committee will attempt to nominate a candidate for each office to be filled and shall secure the consent of each candidate. The list of nominees shall be announced to the congregation in conjunction with the announcements of the meeting of the congregation at which the elections are to take place. In addition to the candidates submitted by the Nominating Committee, additional nominations may be made from the floor. The Congregation Council shall fill vacancies on the Nominating Committee.
5. The pastor(s) shall be notified of the time and place at which the special meeting of the congregation is to be held.
6. Only the business for which a special meeting has been called shall be transacted at the meeting.
7. A meeting of the congregation may, by majority vote, recess to reconvene at a specified time and place. A meeting may also recess to reconvene upon call; provided, however, that the time and place of such a reconvened meeting must be announced at a public service of the congregation, and not less than three (3) days written notice be given for the reconvened meeting.

PART IV - Officers and Boards

At its annual meeting, the congregation shall elect a Congregation Council of nine (9) members for terms of three (3) years each and appoint replacement for vacancy to complete a three (3) year term. One-third of the terms will expire annually. No member shall be eligible to serve more than two consecutive terms in the same office. Should a member's place on the Congregation Council be declared vacant, the Congregation Council shall elect, by majority vote, a successor to fill the unexpired term of the member.

The pastor(s) shall be an advisory member of the Congregation Council by virtue of the office.

1. The Congregation Council shall serve as the trustees of the congregation. They shall be responsible for all matters relating to legal and corporate affairs and shall supervise the maintenance of the properties of the congregation. The duly elected president and secretary of the Congregation Council shall be authorized to sign all documents pertaining to the legal and corporate affairs of the congregation. The Congregation Council vice president may substitute his or her signature for either the president or secretary if either of those individuals is unable to perform the duties of their office. Both the signature of the Congregation Council president and secretary must appear on all documents to make them official.

2. The Congregation Council shall serve as the deacons of the congregation, unless the congregation elects people to serve as deacons. The deacons shall provide spiritual leadership in the congregation, working with the pastor(s), to guide work, witness, worship, and service to the congregation in the world.
3. The Congregation Council shall establish such committees as they are provided by the bylaws and supervise their work. The pastor(s) shall be an advisory member of all committees.
4. The Congregation Council shall determine rosters of the baptized, the confirmed, the voting, and the associate members of the congregation. A confirmed member who does not, for a period of one year, partake in Holy Communion, support the church with his/her offerings, and does not appear to desire to participate in the life, worship, and ministry of the congregation, shall be contacted by the pastor(s) and/or congregation's officers to encourage them to become active members. If, during the second year, the confirmed member remains inactive, his/her name shall be removed from the active membership roster and placed on the responsibility list as one who is in special need of the congregation's prayer and concern. All records of baptism confirmation, marriage, funerals, and church membership are permanently stored for future use.

Duties and Responsibilities of the Congregation Council

In addition to the general duties and responsibilities listed at the beginning of this part of the bylaws, the Congregation Council shall:

1. Review annually the salary of the pastor(s) and make adjustments from time to time within the limits of the budget approved by the congregation.
2. Receive reports monthly from the treasurer to ascertain expenditures are within the budget approved by the congregation.
3. Be responsible for the preparation of a budget for submission to the annual meeting of the congregation.
4. Assure itself that the treasurer and others who have access to the funds of the congregation are adequately insured.
5. Appoint annually an audit/finance committee composed of three (3) members of the congregation (excluding the church treasurer) which shall audit the fiscal records of the congregation, including the endowment fund, and report its findings (in writing) to the annual meeting. Such audits shall include examination of the existing insurance coverage. The committee shall provide guidance on other financial matters on an as needed basis at the request of the council.
6. Be responsible for the buildings and premises of the congregation so that their use is available for the functions of the congregation. Should groups or individuals not associated with the congregation desire to use such property, the procedures outlined in the Church Use Policy document shall be followed.

7. Arrange an exit interview with a departing pastor.
8. Exercise discipline in accordance with the provisions of the constitution.

Duties of Officers, Treasurer, and Financial Secretary

1. The chairperson shall preside at meetings of the Congregation Council and of the congregation.
2. The vice chairperson shall preside at the meetings of the Congregation Council and of the congregation in the absence of the chairperson.
3. The secretary shall keep the minutes of the Congregation Council and of the congregation and shall have oversight of the archives of the congregation. Records shall be recorded and stored.
4. The treasurer shall have custody of all funds of the congregation. The treasurer shall receive and disburse such funds in accordance with the decisions of the congregation and the Congregation Council and make monthly reports to the Congregation Council. All financial transactions shall be signed by the treasurer and at least one Congregation Council officer.
5. The financial secretary shall maintain records of all contributions and make regular reports to the members as required by the Congregation Council.

Part V - Committee Structure and Responsibilities

The Congregation Council shall establish the following committees and supervise activities:

All Things Members (ATM) Committee
Endowment Committee
Fellowship Committee
Finance Committee
Mutual Ministry Committee
Nominating Committee
Parish Education Committee
Personnel Committee
Property Committee
Scrip Committee
Stewardship Committee
Worship & Music Committee
Youth Board

1. The Congregation Council shall also establish and authorize any special or temporary committee. Special or temporary committees may be organized only after authorization has been given by the Congregation Council. The Congregation Council will appoint the original committee members. Special or temporary committees will report directly to the Congregation Council. Temporary committees will present all expenditures to council for approval.

2. The congregational committees shall consist of at least six (6) non-council members with the exception of Personnel, Mutual Ministry, and Finance Committees, who shall have three non-council members each and one Congregation Council member. The Congregation Council members may vote on committee business but may not hold committee offices.
 - a. The non-council members shall serve a two (2) year term.
 - b. One-half the members terms shall expire annually.
 - c. There shall be no limit to the number of terms a person may serve.
 - d. In addition to the above, the president of the senior youth group shall serve as a voting member of the Youth Board.
3. The non-council members shall each be elected by the congregation at its annual meeting (half the members each year).
 - a. The Nomination Committee shall put together a list of names of candidates for the non-council membership positions to be submitted to the congregation at its annual meeting.
4. The chairperson and a secretary for each committee shall be elected at the first meeting of each committee following the congregation's annual meeting. Minutes shall be kept.
 - a. The council representative will report to the Congregation Council monthly.
 - b. The chairperson shall also prepare an annual summary to be included in the congregation's annual report.
5. Each committee shall be directly responsible to the Congregation Council. Should the Congregation Council reject a committee recommendation, it shall:
 - a. Definitively state whether the committee should restructure its proposal or drop the matter totally.
 - b. Give specific reasons as to why a proposal is rejected or what can be done by the committee to make the proposal acceptable to the Congregation Council.
6. Each committee shall meet on a minimum bimonthly schedule with the exception of Finance, Personnel, and Mutual Ministry committees, which shall meet on a minimum quarterly schedule. Due to the uniqueness of the Nominating Committee, one meeting will be held prior to the required submission of their slate of candidates for the annual meeting.
7. Each new committee member shall receive an outline of the committees general purpose for existence. The outline shall include:
 - a. A list of committee responsibilities.
 - b. A list of projects, programs, or undertakings, carried out by the committee in the past or for the coming year.

The above list may be altered or changed by the committee members, subject to council approval.

8. A joint meeting of the Congregation Council, pastor(s), and all committees shall be held within 30 days after the annual meeting of the congregation. The first session should include background information on the committee, its reason for existence and current lines of thought in regard to potential programs and functions. Every new committee member will be given a copy of this congregation's constitution and bylaws. Committee officers shall be elected and meeting dates scheduled.

Responsibilities of the Congregation Committees

1. All Things Members (ATM) Committee

The All Things Members (ATM) Committee shall:

- a. Be responsible for outreach within our community.
- b. Contact and welcome visitors and new members.
- c. Collaborate with other committees and groups within the church family to maintain potential and current member information.
- d. Select, train, and maintain lay ministry roster.
- e. Collaborate with the pastor and/or office to maintain contact with members who have become inactive.
- f. Coordinate the pictorial membership of the congregation.
- g. Emphasize use of Lutheran themed publications.
- h. Coordinate and provide the greeters at worship services.
- i. This committee shall meet on a minimum bimonthly schedule.

2. Endowment Committee

The Endowment Committee shall:

- a. Maintain a permanent endowment fund, the principal of which may not be spent.
- b. Administer the income of the funds as outlined in the Resolution establishing Immanuel Lutheran Church, Independence Iowa, Endowment Fund, 1981.
- c. This committee shall meet on a minimum bimonthly schedule.

3. Fellowship Committee

The Fellowship Committee shall:

- a. Provide a reception for new members into the congregation.
- b. Encourage and promote wider participation by members in the life of the congregation for fellowship and growth.
- c. Provide refreshments for Fellowship Hour on Sundays, receive freewill donations, and properly distribute these funds to meet appropriate needs.
- d. Update monthly table decorations in Fellowship Hall.
- e. Properly decorate the church property for the Christmas season.
- f. This committee shall meet on a minimum bimonthly schedule.

4. Mutual Ministry Committee

The Mutual Ministry Committee shall:

Support

- a. Pray for the pastor(s) and their families and encourage the congregation to do the same.
- b. Provide a relaxed, non-judgmental atmosphere for the pastor(s) to air their concerns.
- c. Be a personal, confidential support group concerned with the welfare of the pastor and their families.
- d. Be a sounding board regarding conditions and attitudes in the congregation.

Evaluate

- a. Assist the pastor(s) in development of priorities of ministry based on the congregation's needs.
- b. Do an annual evaluation of the professional work of the pastor(s) on the basis of responsibilities specific in the letters of call.
- c. Do an annual review of the pastor(s) salaries and benefits and submit recommendations to the church council no later than two (2) months before the annual meeting.
- d. Provide ongoing positive reinforcement and constructive criticism of the work of the pastor(s).
- e. Clarify expectations and images that pastors and congregational members have of each other.

Communicate

- a. Encourage and aid communication between pastor(s).
- b. Relay concerns and expectations of the congregational members to pastor(s).
- c. Relay concerns and expectations of the pastors to the church council and the congregation.
- d. Provide time at each meeting for congregation members to express their concerns in a relaxed, non-judgmental atmosphere.
- e. Help to resolve conflict in the congregation in a Christ-like way.

Educate

- a. Help the pastor(s) identify continuing education needs.
- b. Educate the congregation about the role of the pastor(s) among them and their own role in the mutual ministry.

Structure

- a. The committee shall consist of three (3) members.
- b. A chairperson will be elected annually.
- c. A secretary will be elected annually. Minutes not to be publicly available, referred to only when needed for clarification of an item under discussion by the committee and the Council, only if requested a majority vote of the Council.
- d. This committee shall meet on a minimum quarterly schedule.

Accountability

- a. The Mutual Ministry Committee is accountable to the church council and reports regularly to the council. The chairperson of the Mutual Ministry Committee and the chairperson of the Council will meet following each meeting of the Mutual Ministry Committee to keep communication open between the two (2) groups.
- b. A joint meeting of the church council, the pastor(s), and Mutual Ministry Committee may be called by a majority vote of either group by the pastor(s). Such a meeting shall be held at a mutually convenient time.
- c. The Mutual Ministry Committee shall prepare a general summary for the annual report.

5. Nominating Committee

The Nominating Committee shall:

- a. Consist of three outgoing members of the church council.
- b. Attempt to nominate a candidate for each office to be filled.
- c. Submit a complete slate of candidates to the pastor to be included in the annual report thirty (30) days before the Annual Meeting.

6. Parish Education Committee

The Parish Education Committee shall:

- a. Serve as a selection committee for the Faith Formation Director.
- b. Organize, administer, and supervise Sunday School, Vacation Bible School, and approval of the Confirmation program annually.
- c. Secure and enlist leaders in the above areas.
- d. Evaluate and supervise teaching materials used.
- e. Be responsible for special emphasis on missions, Lutheran World Relief, etc. within the schools of the congregation.
- f. Purchase and provide Bibles within the congregation.
- g. Consider provision of special education opportunities for special needs individuals.
- h. Supervise and support the education program of all societies in the congregation.
- i. This committee shall meet on a minimum bimonthly schedule.

7. Personnel Committee

The Personnel Committee shall:

- a. Pray for the paid lay staff and their families and encourage the congregation to do the same.
- b. Provide for a relaxed, non-judgmental atmosphere for paid lay staff to air their concerns.
- c. Design a job description for each paid lay staff person.
- d. Do an annual review/evaluation of each paid lay staff on the basis of the responsibilities specified in the job description.
- e. Annually review and negotiate salaries and benefits of each paid lay staff person and submit recommendations to the Finance Committee at the appropriate time.
- f. Participate in the selection of new paid lay staff.
- g. Conduct an exit interview for each paid lay staff upon that person's departure from employment with the congregation.

- h. Be responsible for the review and updating of the employment policy and procedures.
- i. This committee shall meet on a minimum quarterly schedule.

8. Property Committee

The Property Committee shall:

- a. Be responsible for an annual inspection of all church properties.
- b. Be responsible for an inventory list of all church property and equipment with approximate value.
- c. Be responsible for service and maintenance of equipment.
- d. Be responsible for the care of buildings (custodial and cleaning service, lawn care and snow removal, etc.).
- e. Work together with the church office to make, issue, and recover keys for church property, and keep and review annually a list of the keys issued.
- f. Check the safety of building facilities (steps, handrails, lights, exits, housekeeping practices, etc.) on a regular basis.
- g. Special projects as directed by Council.
- h. This committee shall meet on a minimum bimonthly schedule.

9. Scrip Committee

The Scrip Committee shall:

- a. The Congregation Council will provide oversight of the Scip Committee.
- b. The Congregation Council will approve use of the scrip funds.
- c. This committee shall report to the Congregation Council on a minimum annual schedule.

10. Stewardship Committee

The Stewardship Committee shall:

- a. Educate and inform the membership in Christian stewardship throughout the year.
- b. Plan and carry out an annual stewardship emphasis.
- c. Inform the congregation about the ministry and needs of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.
- d. Secure commitment of time and talent by members of the church.
- e. Review and evaluate the giving of the congregation.
- f. Report income and needs to the congregation.
- g. Receive memorials given to the congregation, determine how they will be used, and provide for listing them in the memorial books of the congregation. It is the policy of this congregation not to have name plates on gifts given as memorials.
- h. This committee shall meet on minimum bimonthly schedule.

11. Worship and Music Committee

The Worship and Music Committee shall:

- a. Secure choir directors, organists, accompanists, and music directors.
- b. Coordinate the maintenance/tuning of musical instruments with the church office to ensure annual or biannual service is completed.

- c. Recruit choir members and maintain choir robes.
- d. Coordinate preparation of the altar.
- e. Coordinate the ushering program of the congregation.
- f. Maintain a supply of worship items.
- g. Coordinate church chancel decorations through the liturgical calendar.
- h. This committee shall meet on a monthly schedule.

12. Youth Board

The Youth Board shall:

- a. Serve as a selection committee for the Youth Director.
- b. Work with the pastor in supervising the work of the Youth Director. Assist the Youth Director whenever possible.
- c. Provide overall direction for all youth programs in accordance with the Youth Ministry Policy Manual. Update and revise the plan annually.
- d. Serve as advocates for the Youth Ministry program.
- e. This committee shall meet on a minimum bimonthly schedule.

PART VI – Methods of Changing Bylaws

These bylaws may be adopted or amended at any legally called and conducted meeting of the congregation by a simple majority vote of those present and voting.

PART VII – Parish Records

The records of the congregation shall be and remain the property of the congregation. The pastor shall be responsible for the maintenance of the records, except as otherwise provided herein. Upon termination of his/her/their service of the congregation, he/she/they shall have brought the records up to date prior to his/her/their departure. The records shall consist of:

- a. The roster of baptized, confirmed, and voting members.
- b. The ministerial acts performed by the pastor.
- c. The minutes of the meetings of the congregation and church council.
- d. The financial records of the congregation for which the treasurer of the congregation shall be responsible.

The pastor(s) shall report to the secretary of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America such statistics as may be requested and shall annually report to the congregation a summary of preformed ministerial acts.
